Worksheet Completion Hints

Honors classes at WHS is another way of saying College Prep

English: Students interested in Honors English need to have earned a “B” grade or higher in English 8 and be at or above grade level reading. These students should be interested in a challenging college preparatory curriculum

Math: Only students with a “B” or higher G.P.A. in Math should consider enrolling in Section Math I Honors. Catalyst students will enroll in Section Math II Honors.

Human Geography: All AP courses are considered to be the most rigorous curriculum and highly motivated students will be successful in these courses.

Science Honors: Science credit is available in each particular Biology class by approval from the teacher. Honors work must be completed through the duration of the school year in order to be accepted for honors credit.

PE: Most students will take the appropriate PE Fitness class.

Foreign Language: Two years of a foreign language are required for the Regents’ Scholarship and/or admission to University of Utah.

Drivers Ed: You must be 15 by Nov. 1st of your Freshman year to enroll in Driver’s Ed. 2nd semester.

Computer Literacy: Required credit usually taken during 9th or 10 grade. Business Office Professional is the usual choice for most students. Exploring Computer Science is also an option for this credit for students interested in learning about how to design computer software or programming.
