How to Log onto your Student's Accounts:

Each student has a 'label' on their school issued computer that gives them information to use for logging in. The following are tips of how to use that 'label' for the different programs students use frequently at RMMS.

S.I.S.: User Name: Student Number (no Initials) Password: Label


We are encouraging parents to create a Parent Account for their children that attend Wasatch School District. The Parent Account allows you a one-stop login for information regarding grades, attendance, contact information and many more important pieces of information concerning your student and Wasatch County Schools. By keeping the information on your Parent Account current, you will be kept informed on any of the latest information you may need to know about your student and will have the ability to interact with teachers and administrators in an efficient manner.

A username and password will be required to access the parent login portal. Prior to that time, you will need to complete the following:

- Proceed to the following website: www.wasatch.edu
- On the right side of the page click on the Quick Link "Student Information System Login."

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- If you know your username and password, you can enter it here.
- If you have not set up a username and password, click on Request a Username.
 (You will need to know your student's SIS # and birthday. If you need the SIS #, you can obtain It from your student, school or the district office.)
- If you have forgotten your password, click on Forgot your password?
- Once you have successfully logged into the SIS Parent account, please verify and, if needed, update your contact information. Now you will be able to see all of your children's account information from a single login!

Academic Success Tips

1- Establish a specific time and place to do homework daily

2- Fill out a Tracking Sheet daily to keep track of assignments

3- Get organized! Use folders, clean out your back pack, use a

student planner/calendar

4- Work on your homework for 20 minutes (distraction free, no phones, TV, etc.) then take a break for 20 minutes. Repeat until homework is completed

5- Ask your teachers if you can sit in the front of the class

6- Take 10 minutes before you begin homework to come up with a "Plan" and prioritize

7- Take notes in class (not just when your teachers require it)

8- Establish a folder for each class

9- Ask questions when you don't understand something in class

10- Check SIS and Canvas Daily

11- Do extra credit when it is available

12- Talk with your teachers at least weekly to "check in" and see

how you are doing

13- Contact the teacher the next day if you are absent from their class or before you leave if you know ahead of time

14- Read for 20 minutes each day (on top of any required reading)

15- Establish an appropriate time to be in bed. Get at least 7 hours

of sleep each night

16- Eat breakfast every morning

17-Join a school club (being in clubs helps you feel

involved and invested at school)

18- Ask questions and contribute to class discussions daily

19- Be aware of assignment deadlines and turn assignments in daily

20- Take attendance seriously. A student is considered chronically absent if

they miss only two days of school per month (18 days in a year), whether the

absences are excused or unexcused
